# Dedication to The Reader

On Wednesday, May 28, Laurel's combined choir had the honor of being asked to "play an away game" and present music at a ceremony in the Illinois State Library to honor Jim Edgar with the naming after him there of a Reading Room. Governor Edgar has devoted himself in many capacities in Illinois as a public servant, and, along with his wife Brenda, is a member at Laurel. It was certainly our choir's privilege, under the direction of Doug Hahn, to be with the Edgars on this occasion.

The many contributions of Jim Edgar to the people of the State of Illinois (including his service as State Representative and Secretary of State before being elected to be Illinois' 38th Governor) were celebrated at the event during remarks by current Secretary of State Alexi Giannoulias, former State Library Director Bridget Lamont, Congresswoman Nikki Budzinski, and currently serving Governor JB Pritzker. While Secretary of State (which position automatically doubles as State Librarian), Mr. Edgar successfully promoted the construction of the stand-alone State Library. These speakers noted how the moniker "The Reader" was bestowed upon Governor Edgar many years ago, and what a true statesman he is--able to bring factions together to accomplish great things. And in his own remarks, Governor Edgar admonished the members of the public to make use of the State Library (it is across Second Street from our State Capitol between Monroe Street and Capitol Avenue). He likewise instructed the powers that be to open the front doors to the Library! (Entrance is currently through the North doors on Monroe.)

The Illinois State Library is a phenomenally beautiful building, and, as the two librarians amongst our choir members will tell you, is a top-notch library. It is likewise a great place to present music—acoustically it is to be highly praised. Kudos to the ringers our choir picked up—several members of the Capital City Men's Chorus, other friends, and our own Mary E. Myers joined our ranks for the occasion. Our thanks also to the staff of the Illinois Secretary of State's Office who arranged the event so skillfully, seeing to every detail. They even provided a "green room" for the choir, as well as a recently-tuned piano. We felt like rock stars!

# So, What is in the Church History Files?

As I mentioned in the previous article, the church history collection is contained in two fireproof file cabinets Located behind the sanctuary. Previous Church Historian Alice Dyson had saved our history, beginning with a newspaper article describing our very first Sunday School meeting on November 8, 1896. As the centennial anniversary of our founding approached, I put these records in chronological order and placed them in acid free folders within these newly purchased cabinets. Moving through time, the collection contains: newspaper articles from the State-Journal Register; building blueprints; pictures; membership, baptism and marriage records; church bulletins; church directories; the originals to the "Centennial History of Laurel United Methodist Church," which Dr. Frank Nestler and I compiled in

1996; several strands of the orange, red, and gold beads that hung at the altar from 1970-2002; recipes from church members; records of the Women's Society of Christian Service; cassettes of church services; cassettes of interviews in the 1970's with longtime members; pictures on slides; and videos and compact discs of church services and events. I am in the process of putting the videos on flash drives. The slides and cassettes have a very long shelf life, so I have purchased a hand-held slide viewer and a portable cassette player, which will be placed in the files (with instructions on how to use them). I will be checking the compact discs periodically to see if they need to be converted to a modern format. The blueprints date back to 1925. I am having all of them reduced in size, so that they can be stored safely within the file cabi-

## We Have a Latte Grande Dream

Do you enjoy visiting with fellow Laurel friends over a cup of coffee, tea, lemonade, or even the occasional goodie? Our church parlor is a happening place on Sunday morning. As you can imagine, that comes with the faithful work of Laurel volunteers. Volunteers faithfully set up the coffee each week before the Sunday service. Howard Hennessey makes sure everything is turned on and ready Sunday morning and Atsuko is ever faithful to help with cleanup and putting items away. Karen Ettinger is the ultimate planner and makes sure all the supplies and directions are readily at hand and will give you explicit instruction. However, we can use more faithful coffee hosts. We have a dream that, if more sets of coffee host volunteers appear, all will enjoy the fellowship time and only need to do it periodically through the year!

As a Sunday morning host, you **DON'T** have to:

You **don't** have to make the coffee. You don't have to set things up.

If you are in a Sunday School class or attending a service, you **don't** have to miss your class or service.

As a Sunday morning host, you **DO** need to:

1. Before the 1st service: Take the coffee filter baskets and stems out of the three coffee urns, empty grounds into the waste basket, and rinse out the filter baskets. Make sure the hot water carafe water is hot. If needed, replenish water, lemonade, or sugars and creamers. nets. As I label files, I am making a conscious effort to refrain from using cursive writing, as it may not be taught in schools in the future.

- 2. After the 1st and second services: Make sure the hot water carafe water is hot. If needed, replenish water, lemonade, or sugars and creamers.
- 3. After the 3rd service begins, take everything out of the parlor, empty remaining coffee and rinse out pots, clean any serving dishes and put things away in cabinets. Take home any drying towels or dish cloths that were used and launder and return them to the kitchenette. TADA!! EASY PEASY!

## Finance Committee Update

Our report from January 2025 through April 2025:

Excess Income/Expenses	32,155.56
Government Refund*	76,336.47

Total Excess Income/Expenses \$208,492.03

\* This refund was applied for several years ago for wages and benefits paid during COVID. Disposition of funds is yet to be determined by church leadership.

## Trustees Committee Report

Old buildings require ongoing maintenance, some planned and some unplanned, and our church building is no exception. Current issues and projects are as follows:

- The entryway including the church secretary office need replacement carpeting. Cost is \$9,185 with \$2600 coming from our garage sale proceeds.
- The Sanctuary floor along the outside walls has experienced minor settling over the past couple of years. A structural analysis alone will cost \$10,400 not including any future repairs.
- The countertops along the windows in Fellowship Hall are in need of a "facelift" from past water damage. Estimated replacement cost is up to \$12,000.
- Leaking heating/cooling pipes required repair this spring costing \$8,465.
- Required elevator inspections and testing along with emergency repairs at Easter resulted in a bill of \$10,225.
- A roof leak that is damaging the west Sanctuary wall will require investigation and repair. Investigation estimated at \$2000 with wall repair at \$4000.
- Spotlights in the Sanctuary need replacement to energy efficient LED lighting. The fixtures alone are \$6000 with installation an additional cost.

The Trustees want the congregation to be aware of the costs and challenges of building maintenance.
